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The Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award 2024 Overview

The Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award was established in 2021 by the family of Diane Gabriel (1947-2017), one of Vermont's most celebrated artists and educators. This award is given on an annual basis to emerging Vermont-based artists. The Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award encourages experimentation and supports an artist's creative development, especially those artists interested in initiating innovative ideas, exploring new media, or better establishing their artmaking practice.

The award is valued at \$6,000. The recipient is awarded a \$5,000 cash stipend plus an additional \$1,000 value of class registration and/or usage of BCA Studio facilities for one year. Additionally, the recipient will receive support from the BCA Curator and Director of Exhibitions throughout the year, including but not limited to studio visits, review and critiques, and proposal development for future projects.

For the 2024 Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award, an outreach advisory group will be convened to assist in broadening awareness of the award and a separate awards committee will determine the recipient. Each committee will be comprised of artists and individuals from BCA's Exhibitions Advisory Committee, Board of Directors, and members of the Vermont community.

The recipient of the Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award will be announced in May 2024. Deadline for Submission: March 15, 2024, at 5pm EST.

- No individual may receive more than one Diane Gabriel Visual Artist Award.

Definition of Emerging Artist

An 'emerging artist' is an individual at the early stages of their career, who been working less than 10 years and is still refining their artistic direction; does not have a well-established or commercially viable artistic practice. 'Emerging' can be defined broadly. Each juror will use the guidelines to determine and interpret their definition based on the artist's submitted materials.

Jury Criteria

The Jury will be asked to judge the applications based on artistic quality, experimentation and innovation, and commitment to practice.
